- Dominates the city
  - It is Norman fortress right on the river, built in 1190
  - It is a blend of Gothic, classical and Tudor style ✓
  - The long gallery is finest room in the house; it stored picture collection (Any TWO)

- Famous for the Blarney Stone
  - Kissing the Blarney Stone at the top of the castle is supposed to give the kisser the gift of the gab, making him/her a good speaker
  - Gardens around the castle are attractive and good for walks (Any TWO)

- Originally built by the Normans and was the seat of British rule in Ireland
  - The decorated state apartments can be visited
  - Underground excavations reveal elements of Norman and Viking presence (Any TWO)

- On the hills behind the harbour
  - It offers impressive views of the English Channel
  - Country's closest point to Europe for 2 000 years
  - Visitors can see the remains of a Roman lighthouse dating from 50 A.D.
  - The 12<sup>th</sup> century great tower and a fascinating network of secret wartime tunnels (Any TWO)

  - Royal residence
